In addition to operating 13 donor centers and conducting hundreds of community-based blood drives each month, we also provide advanced laboratory and donor testing services, and clinical trial and research support as a national leader in transfusion medicine.

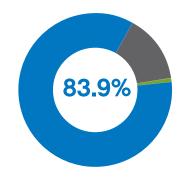
